Remembrance Sunday 2018

The Armistice of 11 November 1918 was the armistice that ended fighting on land, sea and air in World War 1 between the Allies and their opponent, Germany. It is widely accepted that the agreement was signed at 6.00am but the cessation of hostilities was not implemented until 11.00am. So, in this centenary year when we remember the 100th anniversary of the end war in Europe, we will have a short act of remembrance in the Cathedral at 6.00am with a reading, some prayers, space for reflection and a lone piper. Everyone is encouraged to sacrifice some sleep as we remember those who sacrificed much, much more.

Wider Act of Remembrance at 6pm in Cathedral

Remembrance Sunday can be an extremely difficult day for many people, as remembering the fallen can call to our minds loved ones who are no longer with us. As a church, we feel it is extremely important to acknowledge this and to provide a space where we can stand together and support one another in our ongoing experience of grief. So we would invite everyone to our Wider Act of Remembrance at 6.00pm on Sunday 11th November in the Cathedral. The service will consist of 3 hymns, a bible reading, prayers and a symbolic, yet powerful, act of remembrance involving the use of white roses. The service will conclude with some refreshments and the opportunity for ongoing Christian fellowship.
